


Vaulting

Vaulting is a performance sport and originates from Roman times. It is best described as "gymnastics and dance on horseback".

Vaulters perform compulsory and freestyle moves to music on a moving horse at either walk or canter. This is done individually, in pairs or in a squad. This fun sport for all ages promotes coordination, balance, physical health, self-esteem, the ability to work as a team member and lifelong friendship all linked by the overwhelming love and trust of a horse. It enhances one's balance and riding seat so horse riders benefit also. A truly amazing world-wide sport with teams and clubs operating in a vast variety of countries.

Classes:

- Individual Preliminary Walk/Walk/Technical Test
- Individual Preliminary Trot/Walk/Technical Test
- Individual Pre-Novice + Technical Test
- Individual Novice + Technical Test
- Individual Intermediate and above no Tech available
- Pas de Deux Horse

Helmet is no longer compulsory for freestyle tests however, unless an exemption has been approved, then a helmet must be worn for all other classes.

Costs:

Vaulting classes	\$30 per individual (incl GST)
Vaulting Pas de Deux	\$11 per rider (incl GST)
Pool Horse	\$20 per rider (incl. GST)

- Teams Note: Any level, if no horse is available for Canter level, then the vaulter will complete their compulsories at walk but be scored against own level as individual for overall individual winners.
- Note: Vaulters may only do a Barrel Freestyle if they are not able to do their Freestyle on the horse.

PONY CLUB WA - NO DOG POLICY

This is a Pony Club WA event, and the policy of NO DOGS WILL BE STRICLY ADHERED TO. Failure to abide by this policy may result in the elimination of rider(s). Assistance animals approved by the Department of Local Government, Sport & Cultural Industries are exempt from this rule. Persons with an Assistance Animal may be requested to provide their approval documentation.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

A WWC check is required by a person if they engage in certain paid or unpaid work with children, described as a child-related work under the WWC Act. Volunteers engaged in helper duties at Pony Club WA State Championships where the usual duties involve, or are they likely to involve, contact with a child, such as Team Manager, Gear Checking, Marshalling will be required to have a current WWCC unless a parent exemption applies. A Parent exemption applies if you are volunteering and have a child under the age of 18 actively involved in the event at which you are volunteering.

ENTRIES

Entries are online via JustGo. Please make sure entries are in the name of rider and not parent. All ages are taken as of 1 January.

SCRATCHES/REFUNDS/ALTERATIONS

Requests for refunds must be submitted via JotForm together with your medical or veterinary certificate, within 7 days following the competition. Refunds will be processed manually. Refund Requests with a Medical or Veterinary Certificate are to be submitted on JotForm: where is the link?? Or is this supposed to be a full stop?
